Where is the most secure financial investment?
The volatility of profit in turn is disproportional to stability.

Familai

One family will have 49 art collectibles:

1/49 and 2/49 will have the most priority.

Each node in the spectrum will contain an art that will tell a story, the exclusive showcase for the art in the metaverse and the whole 49 will be intricately aligned to finish a whole storyline.

The design of the storyline

49 chapters to tell a story , 49 paintings to capture the entire essence.
Each chapter will have 26 different variations and then in any combination , the whole story line should vindicate all syntax based errors.
There will be 26 different versions of the story, each combination making better gridlines.

Spectra

Spectra aims to provide true decentralized investment with a growth rate that is only UP-hill using art.

Is the person or an organization which owns a familai-specific node.

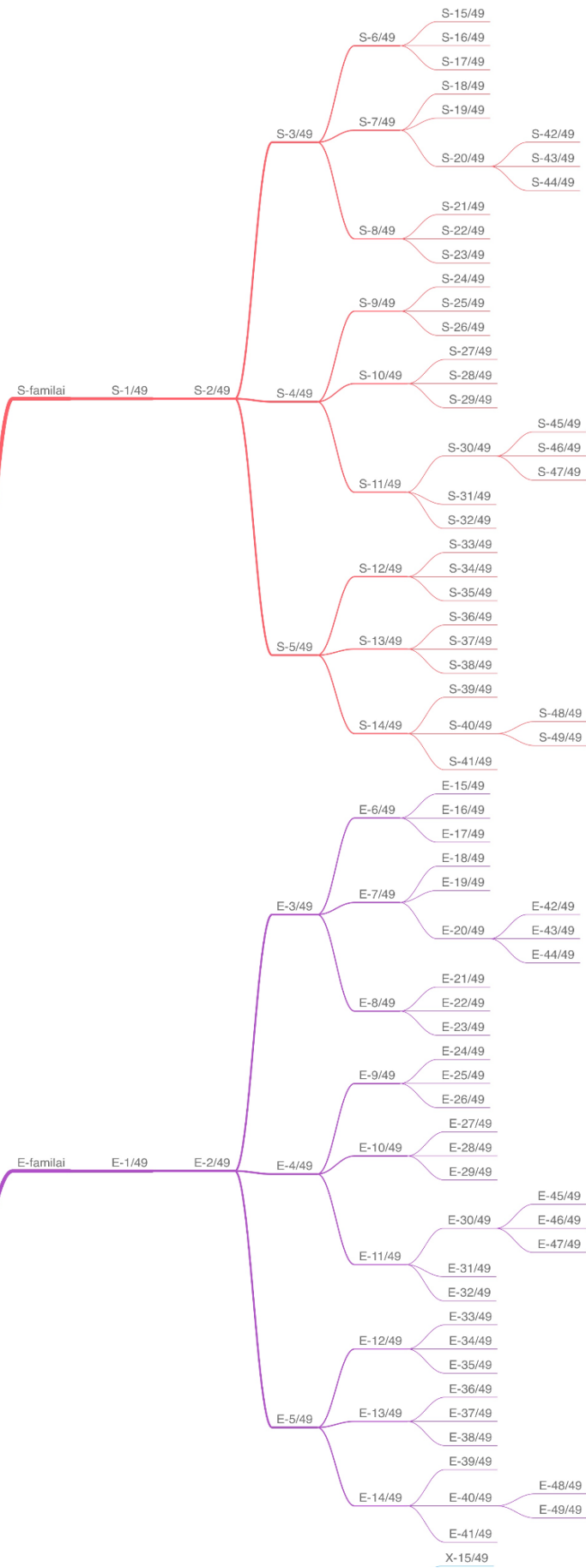
Bifurcation

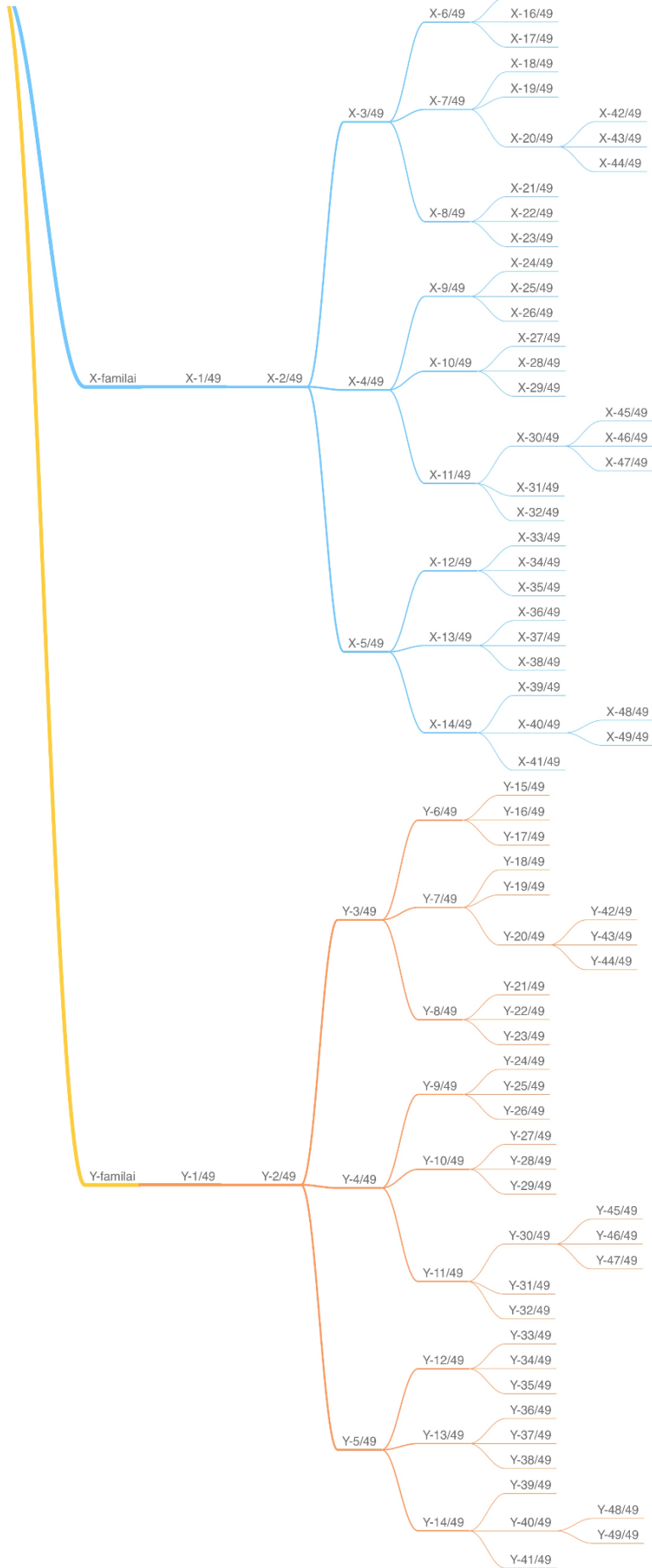
The height of the node in the familia is proportional to the capital gains.

Every Aura is liable to invest 1% of their SPECTRA into any node(including oneself) in an aura's respective familai every month.

The **SPECTRA** of an aura's node can be liquidated within 24 hours and is transferred in the preferred crypto coin to the aura's wallet.

X-aura shall be removed from the system and the node will be held in a decentralized auction system at a compounded value respective to its familai.

The **SPECTRA** of a node can never depreciate from its omega value.

An exclusive showcase room will be designated to the **SPECTRA** art in the metaverse , with all the elements behind the painting , it will also show a virtual number signifying how it is a part of the authentic Spectrum.

Confusion

Also called delirium, is a change in a person's awareness. Confusion affects how a person thinks, sees the world around them, and remembers things. The main signs of mental confusion or delirium are sudden changes in awareness.

Disgust

To provoke loathing, repugnance, or aversion .

Empathy

Excitement of any kind is a state of arousal. Arousal means that the heart rate increases, the sympathetic nervous system increases activity, and the brain begins to signal the increased production of hormones. When a person is excited, their emotions become more powerful.

Can affect an individuals' deductive abilities.

Fear

Fear is a natural, powerful, and primitive human emotion. It involves a universal biochemical response as well as a high individual emotional response. Fear alerts us to the presence of danger or the threat of harm, whether that danger is physical or psychological.

Pros:

Fear helps protect us. It makes us alert to danger and prepares us to deal with it. Feeling afraid is very natural — and helpful — in some situations. Fear can be like a warning, a signal that cautions us to be careful.

Cons:

Fear weakens our immune system and can cause cardiovascular damage, gastrointestinal problems such as ulcers and irritable bowel syndrome, and decreased fertility. It can lead to accelerated ageing and even premature death.

Horror

A very strong feeling of fear, dread, and shock. : the quality of something that causes feelings of fear, dread, and shock.
